Tokikoa is a business proposal for the Basque Country, a place where increasing amounts of Latxa wool are discarded and stored every year. The reason for this waste is the complexity of treatment this wool requires, and the obstacles that suppose disposing of it, since it is both inflammable and ilegal to dispose of due to its consideration as a Category 3 animal by product. This is a huge cause of concern for the farmer community who face both storage issues and economic loss.

Tokikoa aims to be an intermediary that disposes off this wool waste, by processing into pellets that will be used as fertilisers to nurture the soil, closing the circle. The community impact of this regenerative solution has been tested through multiple interviews and conversation with both locals and initiatives tackling this issue. Through community action and collaboration, we aim to bring light into this issue and call for modification of the unrevised laws that stop organic waste from going back to the soil, and therefore following its cycle.

This project includes detailed customer research, a business plan and website to test the viability of Tokikoa's application in the Basque Community.
